- Description This thesis investigates the properties of deponents (verbs with non-active morphology, but active syntax) in several Indo-European languages, with a focus on Vedic Sanskrit, Greek, Hittite, and Latin. I argue that the “voice mismatch” behavior of deponents is rooted in the mechanics of the morphosyntax of Voice in these languages, with deponents introducing a non-canonical agent argument below Voice that triggers non-active morphology. I also reconstruct a number of proto-Indo-European deponents and discuss the consequences of reconstructing “mismatch verbs” for our understanding of the proto-Indo-European voice system.
